# The Bobcat Bands 

## Marching Band

"The Pride of Grandview Heights" is the most visible and recognizable group in the Grandview Heights High School Band Department. Membership is required of all students who sign up for high school band; with the exception of football players.

The Marching Band performs at all Grandview Heights High School football games as well as pep rallies, parades, Marching Band Season-in-Review, and other scheduled events. The marching band rehearses during the school day and select Thursday evenings from 8:00-10:00 pm on selected evenings throughout the football season. Attendance at all scheduled rehearsals and performances is required.

## Concert Band

The Grandview Heights Concert Band is made up of students from the marching band; some performing on specialty instruments. The purpose of the Concert Band is to provide its members with the pedagogy and development necessary to perform at each individual's highest level. The Concert Band performs at all school concerts. Attendance at all scheduled performances and rehearsals is required.

## Wind Ensemble

The Grandview Heights Wind Ensemble is made up of students from the Concert Band. The Wind Ensemble is designed for any woodwind, brass or percussion specialist who is interested in performing a challenging repertoire of music tailored to the performer's needs.

The Wind Ensemble rehearsals are limited which requires the utmost in student preparation. The performance schedules vary from year to year, and are subject to change. Attendance at all scheduled performances and rehearsals is required.

## Jazz Ensemble

The Grandview Heights Jazz Ensemble is a select group of mixed instrumentation that rehearses during the school day. Students interested in any/all idioms of jazz should request this course and complete the audition process in the prior spring semester. The Jazz Ensemble performs multiple concerts per year and, schedule permitting, attends a jazz festival in the Central Ohio area. Attendance at all scheduled performances and rehearsals is required.

## Pep Bands

Pep Band is required for all students registered for band and each student performs at 3 home basketball games. Music selection is similar to the Marching Band. Attendance at all scheduled performances is required.

## Solo \& Ensemble

In addition to the large group ensembles, the Grandview Heights Band Department also encourages participation in small group performance activities such as the OMEA Solo \& Ensemble event. Following the Holiday Concert, students have the opportunity to sign up to learn a solo on their instrument or play as a member of a small music ensemble.

Each soloist and ensemble is provided with weekly instruction from a director for the weeks prior to OMEA S\&E. At the conclusion of the lesson and rehearsal schedule, students perform their pieces for an outside adjudicator, who will offer comments about the performance and suggestions for development.

All students are strongly encouraged to participate in the Solo and Ensemble event, as it is one of the best ways to receive additional personalized instruction from a Director and gain knowledge and skill specific to their major instrument.

## Grading Policy

Students participating in the Grandview Heights Band Program receive 1 credit per year. We believe that music is an important part of the school curriculum and should be graded. Rather than grading students on their ability alone, the Grandview Heights Band program grades students based on attendance, performance, and musical development.

Students in the Grandview Heights Bands earn their grade by fulfilling the academic requirements of each ensemble. Below is a breakdown of how each ensemble is graded.

## Performance Goals

Throughout the year, the Directors will monitor students' musical (and marching) development through various methods including, but not limited to:

- Short Performance Evaluations
- Scale/Excerpt/Rhythm Performances


## Attendance Policy

All band members make a commitment when they join band. These commitments extend to attending all rehearsals and performances. The dates of such are published and made known well in advance. Additionally, directors ensure reminders of rehearsals and performances are part of the daily rehearsal schedule. It is expected that all members will be in attendance at all scheduled events.

Should a student be unable to make a particular rehearsal or performance, then a parent/guardian must complete the "Absence Request Form" a minimum of two weeks in advance of the requested absence. The form is available from the Grandview Heights Bands website - https:// www.grandviewhtsband.org - go to "Documents" to access the form.

In the event of a medical or family emergency, the parent/guardian should contact Mr. Herrmann at a time most convenient to the family's needs by phone or email. Medical and/or family emergencies are automatically Excused. This includes students who are marked 'Excused' absent from school on the day of a performance.

As stated previous, band is co-curricular. As such, work is not an excuse. Communicate clearly with your employer and well in advance. Missing school for work is unexcused; therefore; missing band for work is ALSO UNEXCUSED.

Alternate Performance Assessments (APA) will be assigned to all performance-based absences. The APA will include performing, individually or in small groups, music from the missed performance.

Marching Band Absence Maximum: Each student is limited to two Excused absences during the marching band season (August 14 through November 1); including rehearsals and performances. Requests for exceptions will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

## Code of Conduct

Members of the Grandview Heights High School bands are subject to the Grandview Heights Student Code of Conduct listed in the student handbook. Any member who violates band or school policies will be dealt with following said code.

## Evening Night Rehearsals

The Marching Band will rehearse on selected Thursday nights from 8:00-10:00PM. This two hour block is divided into two parts: full band music rehearsal from 8:00-9:00PM and full band field rehearsal from 9:00-10:00PM. As stated previously, these are mandatory rehearsals. Band members who are in other sports and have a game during this time will be excused for the game but are expected to come to practice upon their return to school or when the game ends. It is the students responsibility to inform the director of their conflict prior to rehearsal. If the student does not take responsibility and forgets, they will be marked absent.

## Athletics/Extra-Curriculars

Many students in the band are also participating in vocal ensembles, drama, other extra curricular activities, and athletics. Participation in band, athletics, and extra-curricular groups is encouraged, but students must understand they are responsible for managing their time invested AND communicating clearly with all directors, coaches, and advisors.

## Cell Phones

Cell phones can present additional distraction to students in a musical ensemble; both in rehearsal and in performance. Therefore, cell phone usage is prohibited unless specifically noted by the director. The following procedures will be utilized if a student is unable to self-monitor their usage during a given rehearsal/performance:

- First Offense: The student will receive a verbal warning to put their phone away, including placing the phone in their storage cubby.
- Second Offense: The student will receive a secondary verbal warning, then the director will commandeer the student's phone and return it at the end of the rehearsal/ performance.
- Third Offense: The student will receive an office referral for classroom disruption and insubordination followed by a request for conference with the student and parents/ guardians.

In all cases, parents/guardians will be notified by the director within 24 hours by email.

## Travel Procedures

## Bus Rules

The Bobcat Bands travel often throughout the year to football games, parades, and other events. When traveling by bus, students are to adhere to the following guidelines:

1. You must ride the bus to which you are assigned.
2. Attendance will be taken by a director/chaperone prior to departure.
3. Directors/Advisors/Chaperones can reassign seats at any time for disciplinary concerns.
4. No shouting, yelling, or horseplay is allowed.
5. No speakers are permitted for use with portable electronic devices.
6. Listen and respect all chaperones on the bus.
7. Travel privileges can be revoked at any time for not following the rules listed above.

## Sign-Out Procedure

'Sign-out" is the option for students to return home with their parent(s) from off-campus events during the marching band season. This option should be requested when the marching band travel schedule presents an undue burden to the student. (Example: Saturday morn ing 7:00am report time for cross country meet.)

Parents are required to submit a "Sign Out" request a minimum of 2 days in advance, utilizing the Attendance Request Form (The form is available from the Grandview Heights Bands website - https://www.grandviewhtsband.org - go to "Documents" to access the form.)

The parent will sign out their student on a list kept by the Directors. Only when the parent has signed out their child to their custody is the student permitted to leave. No students are permitted to ride with anyone other than their own parents. No exceptions!
