2023 GHHS BAND CAMP CHAPERONE INSTRUCTIONS

PLEASE TAKE PICTURES AND EITHER POST THEM TO FACEBOOK GROUP YOURSEELF OR SEND TO <u>GRANDVIEWHEIGHTSBPA@GMAIL.COM</u> AND WE WILL POST THEM FOR YOU.

LOCATION: The students (and you) are staying in 25 West Home (25 W. Home St.), marked with #61 on the map at the bottom of this page. The evening rehearsal takes place at the area helpfully labeled "Practice Field" near the top center of the map, on West St. We recommend driving by the rehearsal field upon your arrival, to see whether the students are still practicing. If so, you may stop there and find Thomas Stanley (see "Room Key" below), before proceeding to the dorm. If the students have already left the rehearsal field, you will need to call or text Mr. Stanley (614-822-1011) at that point, to determine where the students are.

PARKING: You may park your car overnight in any campus lot (marked with blue and white numbers on the map below). We have been advised that you should take care to avoid city lots or street parking, where this may not be permitted.

ARRIVAL: The students will be on the field after dinner until the evening activity (different activity every evening, see schedule below). Please plan to arrive on campus around 8:00pm, or earlier if you want to catch some of rehearsal. NOTE: Monday evening chaperones may wish to arrive a little earlier or else proceed directly to the <u>Westerville Jaycees Pool</u> (230 S. Otterbein Ave). The facility is booked from 8pm to 10pm that evening and is approximately a one mile walk from the dorm, so rehearsal will end a bit early to allow time to change and get to the pool by 8pm.

ROOM KEY: Thomas Stanley is the keeper of the keys for the chaperones, so he will give them to you in the evening with a list of where all students, chaperones and staff are staying on your floor. You may return them to him when you leave in the morning or slide them under his door (room #220).

ROOMS: A chaperone will be placed on each floor in a single room. Bring your own bedding (pillow and sheets or a sleeping bag), and any shower, toiletry, or personal items you may need.

BAND STAFF: There will be adult band staff staying on the floor as well, <u>but we hope to let them sleep</u>. It is your job to make sure the students stay in their rooms after curfew, which is typically around 11pm. Mrs. Olis (740-590-8085) is available if you need her – but again, please do your best to resolve situations without her help first. <u>Basically we are asking you to be a parent and use your best parent judgment</u>. Examples of events for which you <u>should</u> contact Mrs. Olis immediately include:

- Student or staff medical emergency
- Student smoking, vaping, drug, or alcohol use
- Student hazing, bullying, or other harassment activity
- Students sneaking off campus or otherwise unaccounted for

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Walk with the students to the evening activity and help to supervise (different each evening).
- Check in with Mrs. Olis/Mr. Stanley for specific assignments for the evening activity.
- Stay on the floor where you are assigned upon return to the dorm.
- Chaperones must follow the same rules of conduct as the students. Please remember you may not smoke or drink alcohol in the dorm.
- Stay on your floor after 11pm and make sure the students stay in their rooms. They are not permitted to go to other rooms or floors after 11pm.
- While students are getting settled for the night, we encourage you to walk the floor periodically to ensure that students are in their rooms and settling down you may also want to knock and poke your head in each room to confirm the right students are in the right rooms.

WILL YOU SLEEP? Many chaperones do! The students are worked very hard by Mrs. Olis and her Band Camp staff, so they are typically very tired. Still, some students might need to be encouraged or reminded to sleep, particularly early in the week when they are still all wound up.

DEPARTURE: Please plan to stay in your room until at least 6:00am. You may depart any time you like after that. You are welcome to join the students for breakfast before you leave if you like.
